When: Saturday September 16, 2006, 9:00 A.M. - Noon

Where: At Lodi Lake Park, Discovery Center, on Turner Road in Lodi, CA

"Local Team Leaders and Volunteers Being Sought!"

Background- "California Coastal Cleanup Day is the premier volunteer event focused on the marine environment in the country. Each year, more than 40,000 volunteers turn out to over 400 cleanup sites statewide to conduct what has been hailed by the Guinness Book of Records as "the largest garbage collection" (1993). Since the program started in 1985, over 552,000 Californians have removed almost 8.5 million pounds of debris from our state's shorelines and coast. When combined with the International Coastal Cleanup, organized by The Ocean Conservancy and



taking place on the same day, California Coastal Cleanup Day becomes part of one of the largest volunteer events of the year."

Local Effort - For the fourth year, in cooperation with of SJC Public Works - Stormwater Division, the City of Lodi - Parks Dept. and Public Works Dept. will host a local Coastal Commission Clean-up at Lodi Lake Park.

In 2005, garbage from the park areas was collected by teams of volunteers. Each team collected, sorted and kept a record of all debris found. Their findings were then submitted to The Ocean Conservancy's international database. This data is used to identify the sources of marine pollution and helps in their work towards devising solutions to the marine debris problem.

Volunteers will then be divided into teams. Teams will disperse to local areas around Lodi Lake, in the Nature Areas and along the Mokelumne River collecting trash. Teams will then sort and record their findings. Volunteers who complete their work will receive a free tee-shirt, courtesy of SJC Public Works. Work will extend until noon. A group picture and refreshments will follow.
