ORDER OF THE SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICER IMPLEMENTING THE DIRECTIVES OF THE GOVERNOR OF CALIFORNIA AND THE CALIFORNIA STATE PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICER

DATE OF ORDER: JULY 13, 2020

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTIONS 101040, 101470, 101475, 101085, 120175, 120200, 120210 AND 120215, THE HEALTH OFFICER OF THE COUNTY OF SAN JOAQUIN ("HEALTH OFFICER") ORDERS:

- 1. On July 1, 2020, the Governor of the State of California and the State Public Health Officer directed that counties that had been on the County Monitoring List for three consecutive days or more close indoor operations for certain sectors which promote the mixing of populations beyond households and make adherence to physical distancing with face coverings difficult. Accordingly, San Joaquin County issued an order on July 2, 2020, implementing the State's directive closing indoor operations, while allowing outdoor operations with appropriate modifications, for the following sectors: Dine-in Restaurants, Wineries and Tasting Rooms, and Cardrooms. In addition, all indoor and outdoor operation of all brewpubs, breweries, bars, and pubs in the county were ordered closed. The restrictions of the July 2, 2020, order remain in place.
- 2. On July 13, 2020, the Governor of the State of California and the State Public Health Officer directed that businesses in the following sectors in counties that have been on the County Monitoring List, including San Joaquin County, cease indoor operations:
 - A. Fitness Centers
 - **B.** Worship Services
 - C. Protests
 - **D.** Offices for Non-essential sectors
 - E. Personal Care Services, like nail salons, body waxing and tattoo parlors
 - F. Hair Salons and barbershops
 - G. Indoor malls

Outdoor operations of business within these sectors, with appropriate modifications, including physical distancing and face coverings, are allowed.

- 3. All industry or sector guidance documents that have been issued to date, including all infectious control measures outlined in those guidance documents, apply in outdoor settings, and thus must be adhered to.

- 5. There continue to be infections and death rates in San Joaquin County that necessitate a firm and carefully planned and managed response as the California economy is reopened. Notwithstanding prior efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19, the number of hospitalizations in San Joaquin County is escalating rapidly. San Joaquin County has experienced **6,988** cases with nearly **5,026** new cases since June 19, 2020, and 70 deaths.
- 6. This Order is issued in accordance with the March 4, 2020 Proclamation of a State of Emergency issued by Governor Gavin Newsom and Executive Orders N-25-20, N-33-20, and N-60-20; the Public Health Orders of the State Public Health Officer of March 19, 2020, May 7, 2020, and July 1, 2020; the Declaration of Local Health Emergency issued by the Health Officer on March 12, 2020, and the March 17, 2020 Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Joaquin Ratifying the Declaration of Local Health Emergency; and the orders of the County Public Health Officer of March 21, March 26, April 14, April 24, May 8, and June 2, 2020.
- 7. This Order shall become effective at 11:59 p.m., July 13, 2020, and will continue to be in effect until it is rescinded in writing by the Health Officer.
- 8. Copies of this Order shall promptly be: (1) made available at the County Administration Building at 44 N. San Joaquin, Stockton 95202, First Floor; (2) posted on the San Joaquin County Home page (sjgov.org); and (3) provided to any member of the public requesting a copy of this Order.
- 9. If any provision of this Order or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Order, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, the provisions of this Order are severable.
